ABOUT FUNDING ARTS BROWARD (FAB)

Funding Arts Broward, (FAB) is a non-profit volunteer-based organization committed to preserving and cultivating the arts in Broward County, Florida.

FAB was founded in 2003 by artist and philanthropist, Francie Bishop Good, who was joined by a group of 74 dynamic arts enthusiasts to provide much-needed financial support to local visual and performing arts programs.

FAB connects members to the broader arts community through exposure to programs and performances throughout Broward County and through its Grant Program.

Since its inception, FAB has supported programs for over 80 Broward arts and culture organizations. Grant funding is accomplished from FAB’s nearly 200 members, Corporate Partners, donors to “Be the Spark,” FAB’s 20th Anniversary Campaign, and through Private Foundations. FAB has distributed over \$5 million to the Broward arts community since 2003.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It has been quite a year for Funding Arts Broward.

We celebrated FAB's legacy and expanded support for the arts in Broward County.

Our legacy began with the vision of artist and philanthropist Francie Bishop Good who saw the need for more support for the arts and inspired others to help form this new group called FAB in 2003.

In just over two decades, FAB has generated over \$5 million in support to arts groups serving Broward County. We celebrate this legacy and are seeing opportunities to support the arts in our growing and diverse community.

With support from our members and community partners, we want to grow FAB's membership, increase awareness about our role as a funder and innovator, strengthen relationships with our grantees, collaborate with other funders and together find new ways to expand support for the arts in Broward.

We want to expand our outreach and discover what makes the arts in Broward unique.

FAB's "Be the Spark" campaign, launched in 2022 with a goal of raising \$3 million dollars over the next five years to support the arts and has already seen more than \$2.2 million in contributions and pledges. And the impact is already being realized.

The pool available for grants increased by 37% from last year with a record \$385,450 granted to groups for programs in 2024. We expect to have another record amount of \$400,000 available for program grants in 2025. We are seeing more grant requests, more interest from new and emerging groups and more interest from arts organizations in applying for grants in the arts education category.

Another goal is to establish a \$1 million Community Building endowment fund at the Community Foundation of Broward to help sustain FAB as an arts funder. We are well on our way with \$400,000 already committed to the endowment fund.

The Board created a New Initiatives Task Force led by Past President Ed Hashek that has undertaken extensive research on the needs and gaps in arts funding and how FAB could play a part in addressing these needs. The group will publish the report on its findings this year to share with the community. The Task Force also is continuing to develop specific recommendations for FAB to undertake and incorporate in planning for the future.

NEW INITIATIVES TASK FORCE

The FAB new initiative Task Force, formed in May 2023, to investigate the needs, gaps, and aspirations in the art sector. Part of the "Be the Spark" campaign is amid fundraising for these potential new initiatives. Chaired by past president Ed Hashek, members included, from FAB are Mary Riedel, Nancy Bryant, Cindy Eden, Carolyn Lee, Joy Satterlee, Drazia Simon, Steve Schermer, from the Community Foundation, Sheri Brown Grosvenor, from the Broward Cultural Division, Philip Dunlap.

The first stakeholder group included arts organizations, government agencies, academic institutions, and other art funders. The task force interviewed 37 representatives via a one-hour zoom call from June to September 2023. The second stakeholder group comprised of producing art organizations, including FAB grantees and other arts and cultural organizations in Broward. A comprehensive survey was mailed that included over 80 organizations in August of 2023. The third stakeholder group consisted of current FAB board members. Phone interviews were conducted with all members of the board in February of 2024.

The data from this research had similar results for the three stakeholder groups. The top seven concerns and suggestions included advocacy, affordable spaces, art education, collaboration, grantmaking, marketing/shared service, and a signature event/public art.

The FAB Task Force continues to research five of these areas, the goal is to select the FAB recommendations in 2024, the plan is also to produce a comprehensive report that will expand the details of the results and findings from the three stakeholders' group. This will be a meaningful marketing opportunity for FAB to share the investigated work of The New Initiative Task Force with arts related organizations, funders, business leaders and the public sector.

FAB HIGHLIGHTS

2023

GRANTS

The Grant pool for 2024 was announced at FAB's Annual Membership Meeting on March 14, 2023 - \$385,450, the largest in FAB history, which is attributed to our generous members and a contribution from the "Be the Spark" campaign.

INFRASTRUCTURE

FAB added a second employee, Itzel Avila, Administrative Assistant, to join FAB's Director of Operations, Kat Sierra.

MEMBERSHIP

Added 22 members, three corporate partners and five corporate representatives.

BOARD

- Five new Board members were elected to FAB's Board in May. They include Scott Clearwater, Dr. Wayne Lee, Sally O'Loughlin, Nicole Prouty, and Judy Zucker.
- Two Board members retired from the Board after serving six years, one of FAB Founders, Christy Lambertus, and former FAB Treasurer and Grants Co-Chair, Cindy Eden.

TASK FORCE

A Special Task Force was formed to investigate how best to enhance FAB's impact on the arts in our community with some of the proceeds from the "Be the Spark" campaign.

FUNDING ARTS BROWARD (FAB) AWARDED A RECORD \$385,450 IN ITS 20TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR TO ARTS ORGANIZATIONS FOR PERFORMANCES, PROGRAMS AND EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVES IN 2024.

In its 20th anniversary year, Funding Arts Broward (FAB) has raised and awarded a record high of \$385,450 in grants to sustain and cultivate arts programming in the Broward. In 2023, FAB awarded 36 grants of \$314,450 (ranging from \$3,000 - \$12,500) for 2024 for performances and programs to nonprofit organizations. FAB awarded an additional \$71,000 in Education Grants to 10 organizations to foster art appreciation and skill acquisition for grades K-12.

In October of 2022, FAB announced its "Be the Spark," fundraising campaign. The initiative launched with a lead gift of \$750,000 from FAB Founder Francie Bishop Good and David Horvitz. The campaign's goal is to raise \$3 million over five years. Proceeds from this campaign have already significantly increased FAB's grantmaking pool expanding grants for arts education, funding new initiatives for our arts community and securing the future of by establishing an endowment at the Community Foundation of Broward and strengthening FAB as a nonprofit organization.

"We are thrilled with the incredible support we've received over the years to cultivate the arts in Broward County; however, this year is a truly a stellar example of how our community and corporate supporters have united to make a difference," said Ed Hashek, immediate past president of FAB. "Together through memberships and our "Be the Spark" campaign, we have raised \$385,450; 38% more over 2022 and 114% more than just five years ago for a larger selection of diverse cultural grantees. These grants go a long way toward ushering in full-house and in-person performing and visual arts productions, exhibits and presentations."

FAB funded programs include ArtsUnited's "Celebrating Diversity" featuring three concerts highlighting artists from the LGBTQ+ community, Dance NOW! Miami's "POP", a new choreographic work by Diego Salterini exploring allegories of coming of age, love, despair, joy for life, death and more, New City Players' play "1,000 Miles" by South Florida playwright Vanessa Garcia, South Florida Symphony Orchestra's Masterworks V Tchaikovsky | Bruch concert featuring soloist Huifang Chen, and Broward County Film Society's "Get In the Picture," an eclectic motion picture program that will engage and foster dialog among underserved members of the Broward community.

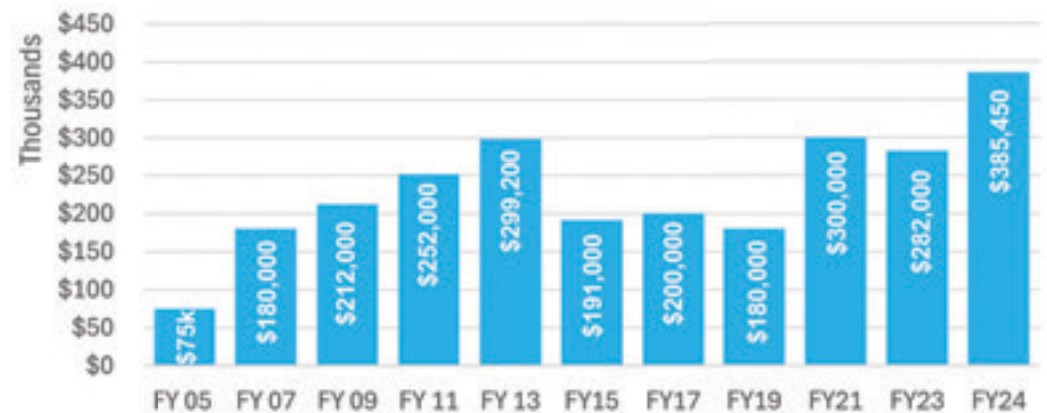

FAB is pleased to share a recap of our curated specialty arts experiences for members and guests. Throughout the FAB year, we coordinated five signature events, including the BW at the NSU Art Museum, FAB's Annual Membership Meeting, The Grant Awards at AARLCC, FAB's Season Kick Off at Northern Trust, and introduced an open call for artists for Art Share, our members' exhibit at Art Serve. In collaboration with FAB grantees, our members enjoyed four exclusive "But for FAB" programs, fostering a direct connection between members and the local arts and culture organizations FAB supports. Additionally, our new program series "Hands on Art" was launched in the summer of 2023, offering members unique creative experiences. In total, FAB hosted 15 events, which also include Fundraisers and networking events.
