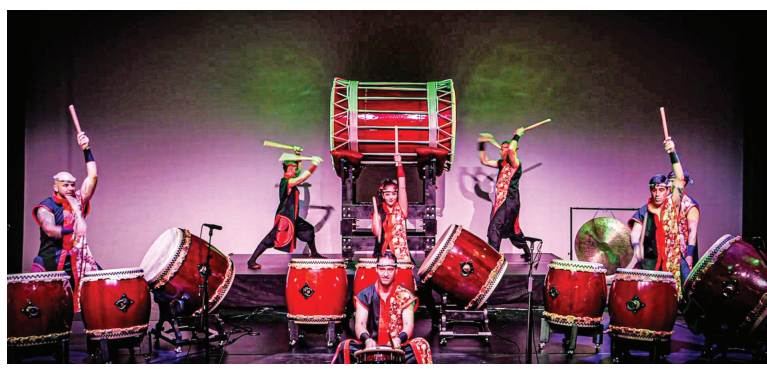

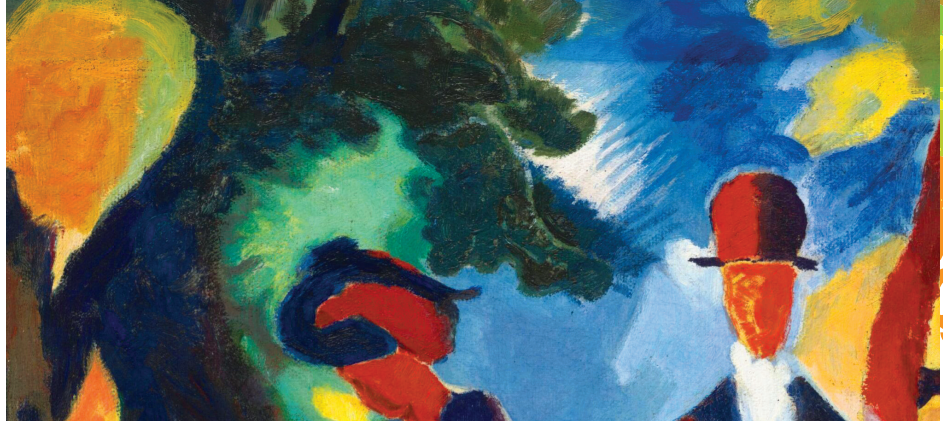

what we do and why we matter

What We Do: Our Support in Action

We invest in nonprofit arts organizations through program grants

1 For most of FAB's history, our core work has been grantmaking to Broward-based nonprofit arts organizations, supporting visual and performing arts experiences that serve residents across the county. These grants help organizations deliver programs that build audiences, strengthen community engagement, and sustain artistic excellence.

We expand arts education access where gaps exist

2 In 2021, FAB expanded its legacy funding program by introducing a dedicated Arts Education grant category. These grants empower arts organizations to connect with young learners and inspire the next generation of artists through immersive experiences in dance, theatre, film, and visual arts.

3 In 2024, FAB responded to key findings from "Enriching the Arts," a data study conducted in 2023 that revealed critical gaps in arts education across Broward County public schools.

As a result, FAB awarded two 3-year Arts Access grants totaling \$300,000 – marking several significant milestones: FAB's first multi-year grants, its first upfront funding model, and a first-time funding collaboration with the Community Foundation of Broward.



what we do and why we matter



We directly elevate visual artists through community initiatives

In recent years, FAB expanded beyond organizational grants by launching initiatives designed to support working visual artists directly creating platforms for visibility, access, and new work.

These include:

- Art Share Artist Showcase
- Living Lens Photographers Showcase

Collectively, FAB has supported and provided access to more than 100 independent artists by hosting exhibitions and actively promoting their work.

We activate public engagement and innovation through partnerships

Also under the Spark Campaign, FAB funded a public art pilot project, FAB Goes Public, further responding to the findings of the “Enriching the Arts” data study. Exploring the intersection of art and technology, the project ran from January through April 2025 in partnership with the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, The Parker, and Mad Arts. Two Broward-based artists received grants to create original works, which were proudly displayed on The Parker’s exterior wall facing Federal Highway.

We aspire to be the connectors – the thread that ties it all together

Through our partnerships with arts organizations, philanthropists, the community at large, and arts leaders and lovers alike, FAB works to connect and unite Broward County around a shared passion for the arts. Through meaningful engagement and a spirit of collaboration, our goal is to be the glue that brings these diverse groups together, all united in championing the arts.

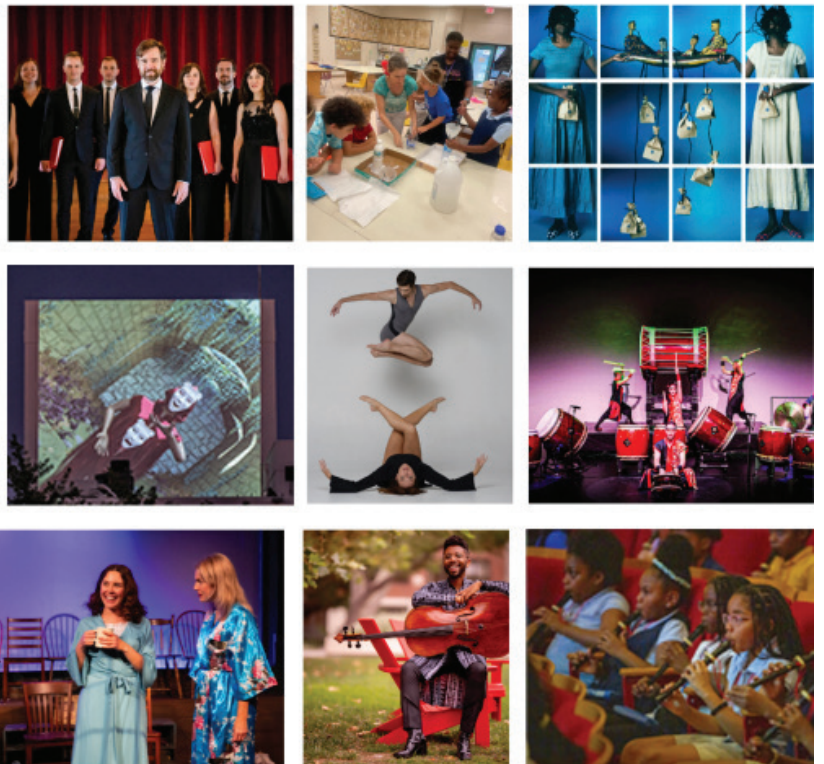

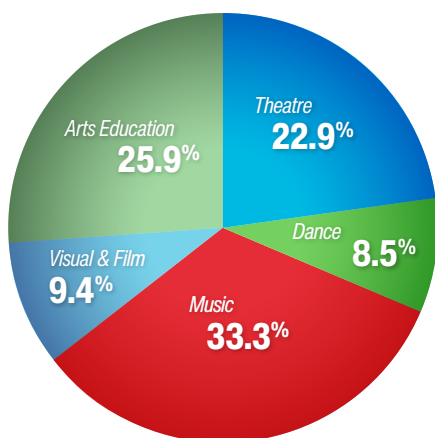

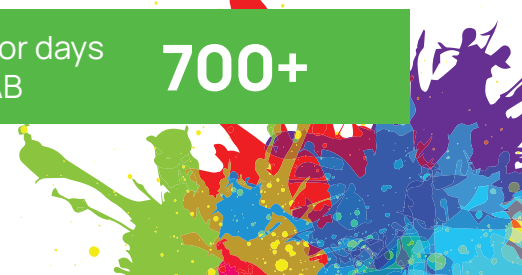
FUNDING ALLOCATIONS BY DISCIPLINE

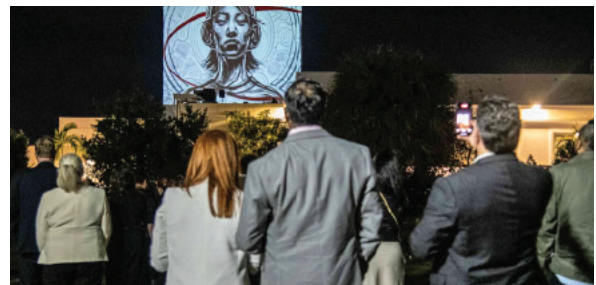


October | FAB 2025 Kick-Off Event – Northern Trust & New City Players October 2025

what SPARK set out to do



From the beginning, SPARK was built around a focused vision – to identify the areas of greatest need in the community and direct meaningful funding there. The campaign was never about doing more of the same. It was about doing what had not yet been done.

SPARK was designed to drive essential outcomes:



Expand Grantmaking – Adding an average of \$167,500 annually to FAB’s legacy grant program, opening the door to new categories of funding including arts education.

New Initiatives – Directing resources where they are needed most. This means bringing the arts back into classrooms that had gone without through the Arts Access Grant Program. It means supporting working artists through a public art program that creates visibility, opportunity, and economic investment in the creative community.

Secure the Future – Establishing a \$1 Million endowment fund at the Community Foundation of Broward, ensuring that FAB’s ability to serve the community goes on.

Infrastructure Support - A core funding objective of the Spark Campaign was to strategically allocate resources toward two key priorities: expanding access to technology that better supports our grantees’ marketing and outreach efforts, as well as strengthening foundation and member awareness – and investing in key staff additions to enhance the administration of our grants process and overall organizational support

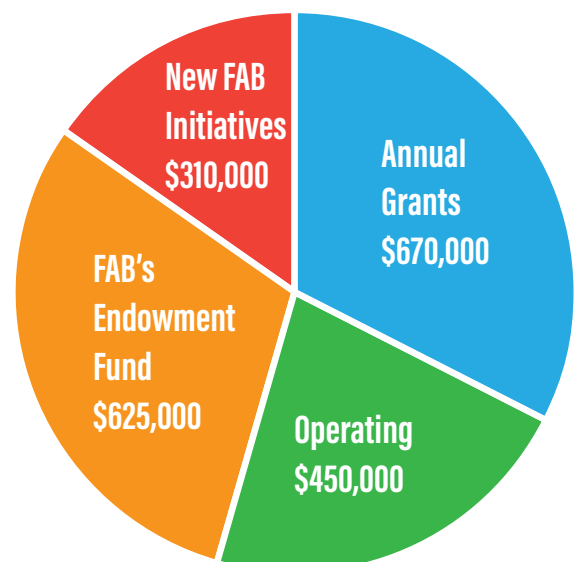
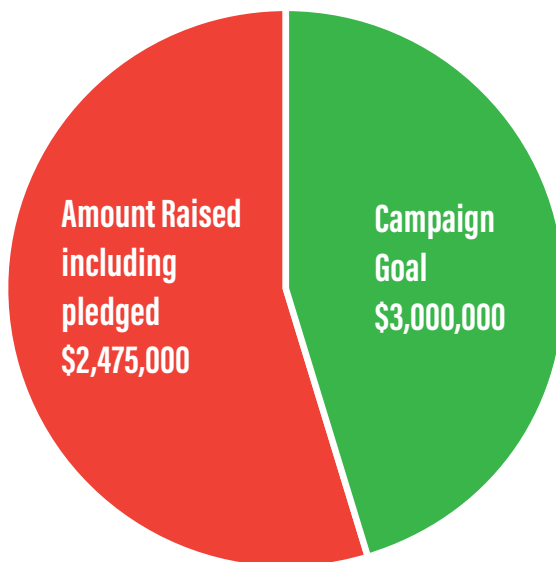

In October 2022, on the occasion of FAB's 20th Anniversary, the organization took its most ambitious step yet. SPARK was not simply a fundraising campaign. SPARK was designed to do what FAB's existing grant program could not do alone: expand reach, deepen impact, and build a foundation that endures.

A Bold Bet on Broward Youth

Some investments are transactional. Others are transformational.

When Funding Arts Broward launched its Arts Access Grant Program, it made a bold, deliberate statement: the arts belong in every classroom, for every child, regardless of zip code. Fueled by donors through the SPARK Campaign and strengthened by a match grant from the Community Foundation of Broward, this initiative turned community generosity into lasting opportunity.

Two organizations. Three years. \$150,000 each. A singular mission – to bring high-quality, meaningful arts education back to Title I schools across Broward County. This is what that investment looks like.

Two Programs. One Purpose.

Art Prevails Project – Write it Out & Speak Your Peace

A ninth-grader at Miramar High School walked into her first Write it Out session quietly – head down, notebook closed. Writing, she would later admit, had never felt like something meant for her. Ten weeks later, she stood at the front of the room and read her poem aloud. The room went still. Then it erupted.

That moment – a published chapbook in her hands, her name on the cover – is the heartbeat of what Art Prevails Project does. Through their in-school residency program **“Write it Out”** and devised theatre series **“Speak Your Peace”**, professional teaching artists work directly alongside students to transform creative expression into a tool for confidence, identity, and academic growth.

In Year One, Art Prevails Project expanded across six Broward County Title I schools, reaching students in elementary, middle, and high school classrooms – and intentionally extending programming to students with varying exceptionalities at Hollywood Hills High School and William Dandy Middle School.

FAB's support didn't just fund programs – it funded people. A full-time Education Manager. A trained, growing corps of teaching artists. The professional development that keeps the work sharp, culturally responsive, and student-centered. Because when you invest in the right people, they invest everything in the kids.

ARTS EDUCATION ACCESS GRANTS Fueled by FAB's SPARK Campaign

South Florida Symphony Orchestra – Symphony in the Schools

At Driftwood Middle School – a Title I campus in Broward County – students had never had access to professional instrument instruction. Not once. That changed in Year One.

“SIS gave our students an opportunity usually reserved for more affluent communities. The clinicians also helped improve my own teaching. Your musicians raised the performance level for everyone involved.”

Through its Symphony in the Schools initiative, the South Florida Symphony Orchestra deployed 26 professional teaching artists across 18 Broward County schools, delivering instrument fittings, Jump Start Camps, sectionals, master classes, after-school strings programs, and live concert experiences – many of them firsts for the students involved.

At Sea Castle Elementary, an after-school strings program grew into a 25-piece student orchestra that performed on the stage of the Broward Center for the Performing Arts. At Indian Ridge Middle School, consistent SiS instruction helped the top ensemble earn Superior ratings across every MPA category – the school's highest performance achievement to date – with a 95% student retention rate. At Hollywood Central Elementary, once threatened with closure, the Symphony is now helping school leaders reimagine their future as a potential arts magnet campus.

fab goes public

A Public Art Pilot Program
January – May 2025

In January 2025, Funding Arts Broward launched FAB Goes Public — a bold public art pilot program that transformed the west-facing wall of The Parker Theatre into a dynamic canvas for projection mapping installations. Developed in partnership with the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, the Broward Performing Arts Foundation, and Mad Arts Museum, the program expanded FAB’s reach beyond traditional venues, bringing world-class art directly to the community.

FAB Goes Public supported two emerging local artists — Rosanna Kalis (Fast Forward) and Miguel Gonzalez (Muses Awaken) in creating original large-scale works, elevating their careers and introducing new audiences to the possibilities of digital and public art.

Educating the Next Generation Building a Creative Network

Investing in the Future of Art

FAB Goes Public wasn't only about the installations — it was about building a pipeline of future artists. In partnership with Mad Arts Museum, FAB supported the Mad Arts Academy Workshop, a hands-on projection mapping experience for students. With 59 applications*received for just 11 available seats — an acceptance rate of 18.6%— the workshop demonstrated overwhelming community interest in arts education and digital media. Under the mentorship of the program's featured artists, students gained direct, practical experience with an emerging art form at the intersection of creativity and technology.

FAB Goes Public strengthened partnerships across Broward's cultural community — connecting FAB, The Parker, the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, and Mad Arts Museum in a shared mission to make art accessible to all.
